

ITEMS REQUIRED TO PREVENT AUTOMATIC DISMISSAL UNDER 11 U.S.C. §521(i)(1)

- Under the *Bankruptcy Abuse Prevention & Consumer Protection Act* (BAPCPA) of 2005, certain documents must be filed within 15 days of the filing of the petition. In the Northern District of Florida, the following items must be filed:
 - List of creditors.
 - A schedule of assets and liabilities (Schedules A,B,D,E & F).
 - A schedule of current income and expenditures (Schedules I & J).
 - A Statement of Financial Affairs.
 - Certificate pursuant to §342(b), if applicable (debtors signature on petition certifies compliance with this provision).
 - Copies of all payment advices or other evidence of payment received within 60 days before the filing of the petition, by the debtor from any employer of the debtor.
 - *A statement of monthly net income itemize to show how the amount is calculated
 - Chapter 7 - Form 22A (Statement of Current Monthly Income and Means Test Calculation) only if debts are primarily consumer debts; or
 - Chapter 13 – Form 22C (Statement of Current Monthly Income and Calculation of Commitment Period and Disposable Income.
 - *A statement disclosing any reasonable anticipated increase in income or expenditures over the 12-month period following the date of the filing of the petition.
- If any of the documents are not filed the case is subject to automatic dismissal.
