**FOURTH ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER REGARDING HURRICANE
MICHAEL: INACCESSIBILITY OF CLERK'S OFFICES PURSUANT
TO FED. R. BANKR. P. 9006(a)(3)**

The Court has determined that due to loss of power in the Clerk's Offices in Pensacola and Tallahassee, Florida caused by Hurricane Michael, exigent circumstances justify implementation of an Administrative Order. There is no Clerk's Office in Panama City, however, due to the extreme damage and circumstances parties and attorneys may find themselves in, the Clerk's Office is deemed inaccessible in that division as well. Fed. R. Bankr. P. 9006(a)(3) allows the Court to extend time filing requirements under Rule 9006(a)(1) when the Clerk's Office is deemed inaccessible.¹ For these reasons, it is

ORDERED: For purposes of Fed. R. Bankr. P. 9006(a)(3),

¹ Fed R. Bankr. P. 9006(a)(3): "Unless the court orders otherwise, if the clerk's office is inaccessible: (A) on the last day for filing under Rule 9006(a)(1), then the time for filing is extended to the first accessible day that is not a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday; or (B) during the last hour for filing under 9006(a)(2), then the time for filing is extended to the same time on the first accessible day that is not a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday."

1. For all Northern District Cases and adversary proceedings, the Clerk's Office in Tallahassee, Florida is deemed inaccessible from Wednesday, October 10, 2018 through Sunday, October 14, 2018.
2. For all Northern District Cases and adversary proceedings, the Clerk's Office in Pensacola, Florida is deemed inaccessible from Wednesday, October 10, 2018 through Thursday, October 11, 2018.
3. For cases assigned to the Panama City Division, all Clerk's Offices are deemed inaccessible indefinitely from Wednesday, October 10, 2018 until further order of the Court.
